

Housing Policies

Students should be familiar with CEA CAPA's *Participant Housing Agreement Form* prior to the program start date. This information was provided to students in their pre-departure materials and can also be found on our website at <https://www.ceastudyabroad.com/student-policy>.

Description

The Student Residence is in an historical building in the Prati neighborhood. Students share double and triple bedrooms, all single sex and with single beds, wardrobes, and desks.

The rest of the building is equipped with shared fully equipped kitchens, dining areas, shared single sex bathrooms, laundry, study rooms, lounge room and a very nice outdoor patio.

Public transport is easily accessible, as there are multiple bus stops near the building and the metro stop Lepanto is right beside the building.

The campus is populated by students from other study abroad programs, but CEA CAPA students have private double/triple bedrooms that they do not share with students from other programs.

Meals

Meals are not included but kitchens are available and can be used at any time (a reservation at the front desk is required). Kitchens also include fridges and microwaves, always available to students.

Bathroom

Same sex shared bathrooms are available on each floor.

Linens

A set of bed linens and towels is provided.

Laundry

The laundry room is equipped with washers and dryers. The cost is 2 euro for each service, both for the washer and for the dryer. Students must purchase their own detergent.

Internet access

WIFI internet access is available.

Location and Transportation

The residence is 10 minutes walking distance from the CEA CAPA center. Public transport is easily accessible, as there are multiple bus stops near the building and the metro stop Lepanto is right beside the building.

Smoking

Expect that smoking is not permitted in your residence.

Guests

Guests are allowed from 7 am to 11 pm (no more than 2 per student). They are requested to show their ID and leave it at reception for the time of the visit.

Curfew

There is no curfew. You will always be able to access with your electronic key.

Keys & Security

Each student will be issued keys and an ID card upon check-in. If keys are lost during the program, students will be responsible for the cost of replacement.

Utilities

Utilities are included. Please note that electricity is very expensive in countries outside the US. Students are expected to be mindful of this when using electricity in their host country, and to be conservative in their use.

Check-in/Check-out

Students will be guided on the check-in procedure before their arrival.

CEA CAPA will monitor student housing check-out at the end of the program. You must adhere to the proper checkout procedures when vacating CEA CAPA housing, which include turning in keys, removing personal items, waste, and debris, and leaving the room in an acceptable, clean condition. The CEA CAPA Onsite Staff will make every effort to inform students of any fees that will be withheld from the program deposit prior to departure; however, CEA CAPA reserves the right to inspect housing after students' departure. Please note that all housing must be vacated on the program end date no later than 10:00pm (noon).

Housing problems

You should report any problems related to the maintenance directly to the residence's staff, but you can always refer to the CEA CAPA Rome staff for any request.

Damages

Students must respect all furniture, property, and other items provided. All damage, even unintentional, will be billed to the student responsible. If responsibility cannot be determined, the cost will be split equally among the students involved. Please note, if excessive cleaning and/or trash removal is required at the end of the program, students will be responsible for all additional costs incurred.
